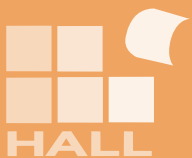

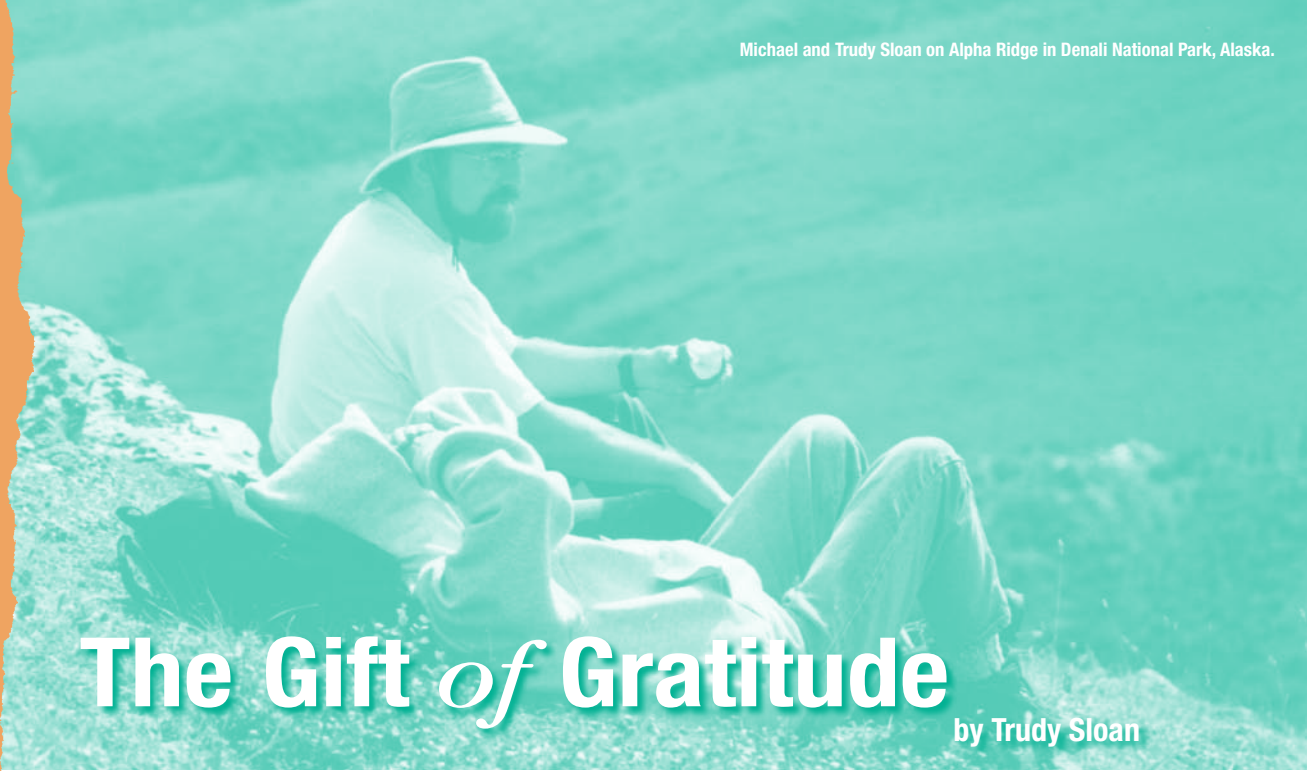

# The Gift *of* Gratitude

In the last weeks of his life, my husband, Michael, spoke quietly of his final wishes. True to his nature, they were simple but very genuine. One of those wishes was to designate the Kennebunk Land Trust as the recipient of any gifts in his memory.

Michael had a great love of the natural world. Over the years we visited many amazing places. He always had his camera in hand on those trips as he tried to capture the wonder of this world. I have only to glance up at our family room walls to see some of his photographs. African lions, Bengal tigers, and the giant tortoises of the Galapagos Islands all look back at me each framed by their own unique landscape.

No matter how much Michael enjoyed our travels, though, he had an even deeper appreciation for what was right here at home. For almost twenty one years we've lived close to the Mousam River exploring the woods and saltmarsh along its banks in all seasons.

He never tired of it. This landscape was, like family, an integral part of his daily life. He cared about it and for it.

As Michael faced the challenge of a terminal illness, he continued to find pleasure and peace in nature. Walks became rolls in a power wheelchair. We joked about the 'sunset club', our private term for driving along the beach at dusk. Even when failing respiration finally confined Michael to the house, he liked to sit where he could watch the birds come and go at our deck feeder.

Michael's choice to direct gifts to the Land Trust was an expression of gratitude, a last thank you to the natural world for all the joy and wonder it had brought into his life. It was also a statement of how important he felt it is to care for it. He was much too modest to ever think of himself as leaving a legacy, but he would have been quick to agree that he was passing one on. The definition of a legacy is something received from an ancestor or from the past. Michael always treated the natural world as if it were a wonderful gift he'd been given. I think he wanted to encourage all of us to treasure that gift and to remind us gently that, in the fullness of time, we too will pass it on.

Image Makers 2009 was the recent photo contest and sale co-sponsored by The Kennebunk Library and Kennebunk Land Trust. This year's event saw record numbers of attendees at the free framing and matting workshop, as well as a greater number of participants to the contest itself. Image Makers 2009 welcomed both professional and amateur photographers of all ages.

A fifth grader from Natick, Massachusetts, Chautauqua is a regular visitor to Kennebunk. He and his aunt, photographer Nora Ordway of Kennebunk, often set out on photo safari. On these occasions they set themselves the challenge of gaining photography experience capturing images such as repeating patterns, reflections, and color schemes. Chautauqua's grandfather, a forensic photographer, gave Chautauqua a camera in 2006 and the eleven year old has been taking photos ever since.

His winning photo, "Dog Dreams" was taken at Harris Farm in Lyman. When asked what motivated him to take this photo, Chautauqua answered "Gracie (the dog) looked so happy and peaceful, as if she were in her own little world. It just made me want to take her picture. Also, I'm an animal lover."

He was recently a solo singer in a local theatre production of "Annie" and he will soon audition for the television program America's Got Talent. He plans to go to Hollywood as soon as he is 18 years old. Upon learning that his photo was selected for the award, the eleven year old said, "I am so excited!"
